Lina + Synesthesia

'Lina + Synesthesia' is a project exploring the links between improvised music and synesthesia. As a musician with synesthesia, I am really interested in the portrayal of the visuals I experience while playing and listening to music. This improvised performance alongside musicians Sam Jordan (Flute), Luke Allsup (Bass) and Fenella Sharp (Drums) allows audience members to experience the feeling of 'seeing music'. Experiences with synesthesia vary from person to person and as a result, I worked with Tom Williams to create visuals that best depict my experience with synesthesia. These will be projected during the performance and respond in real time to the music being performed on stage. As the music is improvised, the synesthetic visualisations are unpredictable and will be connected to microphones around the stage, causing the animations to change with the volume and pitches of the music.

Tonight marks the debut of this performance, with the full version taking place on June 10th at Crookes Social Club (7pm, Free Entry)
